Accommodation

Cost for a room at the Sefton is from £140-160 depending whether pre-paid or pay-on-the-day. The hotel was chosen due to convenient parking. Booking is also available via [booking.com](https://www.booking.com) (for points). Hotel staff have said they don't offer freebies or discounts and that [Booking.com](https://www.booking.com) is as cheap as them direct.

Ferry

Liverpool to Douglas on the Friday 12 April: 11:15 am arrive at 14:00

Douglas to Heysham Sunday 14 April: 20:00 to 23:45

Or Douglas to Liverpool 15.00 to 17.45

Ferry is a short stay package £132

A suggestion

Book the hotel on the pay-on-the-day option so you can change or cancel without having to lose a lot. (I did this and it cost me £15 extra over prepayment) cheaper than cancellation insurance if something comes up.

While you can change the time of your chosen ferry up to the night before, you do have to pay extra for this. The Saver deal applies to all sailings. However, if you need to swap from a high peak to low peak fare then the extra is less than vice versa. So, using the return times if you not sure when you want to return then changing from the Liverpool return to Heysham you would pay less than the other way around.

The plan

Friday afternoon, on arrival head to the sound cafe: <https://thesound.im/> coffee and then head back to Douglas and book in.

Saturday: start off with a lap of the course and then explore some of the coast roads (a lot of the TT course now has speed limits).



Sunday morning, similar but maybe a focus on the Peel side heading over to Douglas in the afternoon and letting those who opt to take the Ferry to drop off and the rest to try the course in reverse.

Seven riders have already made their bookings and more would be welcome to join. All travel and hotel arrangements are to be completed individually but we do ask you to let us know so everyone can contribute on selection of final routes, coffee stops and restaurants.

The Dynamic Duo go to Spain, part 3

Wednesday morning brought the sun out and a new challenge for the day. Ian and I had breakfast and readied ourselves for the trip to Canfranc Estacion. Ian



took the lead and we headed off to France as we were based in the Spanish Pyrenees. We followed the signs for France and came to a set of traffic lights. The border crossing was a single lane road tunnel through the mountains. After about twenty minutes the light turned to green, then we and the queue of traffic behind us entered the gloom. We emerged from the tunnel into the bright sunlight of France. We continued our journey of expedition and enlightenment for a couple of hours but no signs for Canfranc were evident. It

was time for a coffee stop and map consultation. The coffee was good but not so the news from the map. Having eventually found Canfranc on the map, it



seemed to be in Spain not France. Why had we decided it was in France?

Blank looks were exchanged. Neither of us were prepared to take the blame. We put it down to the fact that we were just clueless. There was no easy solution due to the limited crossing points back into Spain. We would have to return to our starting point and begin again. Instead, we sensibly decided continue our day of discovery in France and reschedule our visit to Canfranc for following day. Discovery and exploration it was

then. Looking at the map we were in ski country or we would be if it was winter. We got back on the bikes and headed up the twisty mountain roads. The scenery was spectacular, the road had little to no Armco on the bends. If you got it wrong, then it was a long way down, something not to dwell on. We made it to the top of the mountain where it was misty and cold. A few other bikers were gathered taking in the limited view. Having become quite cold we descended to warmer climes and started to meander our way back to Ainsa when we ran into a rainstorm of biblical proportions. We saw a hotel where we waited out the storm drinking coffee. The downpour lasted about forty minutes. Returning to the bikes, I discovered that I had left my gloves on my tank bag. They were sodden. However, being well prepared I had a spare set of gloves in my top box. We set off again and two miles down the road, it was dry. There had been no rain at all, the mountains must have their own micro climate, very strange. We arrived back at the tunnel to Spain and waited patiently for the green light. As we waited, we watched a helicopter land and pick up some equipment that I assume was needed for rock face





stabilisation. The lights changed and we were off back to Spain and our hotel in Ainsa. Having parked at the hotel, we changed and went into town for a drink and food, avoiding the terrible restaurant from the previous evening. We opted for the restaurant that we had dropped into for a drink on the previous evening on our way back to the hotel. The food was good, the wine was full bodied and we dissected the days ride, laughing at how we had got it so wrong. With our new, hard-won knowledge we knew which route we would be riding in the morning. Having eaten well, watched a great sunset and added to our data base of great rides and memories we walked back to our hotel and into dream land. Will we ever see Canfranc Estacion? You will have to wait and see.

4.	<p>Chairman's Report – Dave Cox</p> <p align="center"><u>Chairman's Annual Report 2022/2023</u></p> <p>Firstly, thanks to you all for attending this evening, it's great that so many of you have taken the time to come along.</p> <p>I'm pleased to report that the group is in very good health, not only financially as you will hear later but also in terms of membership but also in the quality and quantity of training the group is providing for our associates.</p> <p>This is due to the contribution from the committee members and our Observer teams, who give up so much of their spare time. Thanks to you all.</p> <p>The group bounced back well from Covid and now finds itself in as strong, if not stronger, position than pre pandemic.</p> <p>We do though still have many long-standing loyal members, who despite always being the first to renew their membership, unfortunately we rarely see.</p> <p>We've reintroduced the group social evenings with a new venue here at The Duke of Gloucester and appointed a Social Secretary, Howard Payne, who has already two excellent guest speakers including Jamie Whitham. He has more planned and it would be great to see as many people here as possible.</p>



5.	<p>Looking ahead to the coming year, I don't see any reason why the group shouldn't continue to prosper and thrive.</p> <p>Chief Observers Report - Dave Cox</p> <p>Chief Observers Annual Report 2021/2022</p> <p>As previously reported the group seems to have overcome the worst effects of Covid and after a lean year last year, we are once again welcoming associates.</p> <p>Certainly, last year numbers dropped but already this year we have 14 associates in training.</p> <p>One effect of the low numbers of associates last year was the change from the group guidance-training model to a one-to-one system.</p> <p>This provides a for a more structured program tailored to the needs of the associate whilst being more convenient for both the Associate and Observer.</p> <p>One potentially exciting news to report is that I was recently contacted by Cheshire Police to assist with their revamping of their BikeSafe workshops. Police officer numbers was always the issue, so I've been asked to provide Observers to assist to support BikeSafe ride outs.</p> <p>There are currently approximately 300 people on the waiting list from all over the County, so I've been in contact with Warrington, Congleton and Wirral inviting them to get involved. Warrington and Congleton are supportive and happy to assist; Wirral group unfortunately weren't able to assist.</p> <p>Arrangements are ongoing and I'm hoping to hear back soon with firm dates for the workshops.</p> <p>The last bit of news is just to make you all aware of the coming changes to the Local Observer and Local Observer Assessor qualifications.
